Please note that the import requirements and approved commodities listed below are subject to change at any time during the duration of this permit. This APHIS-issued import permit only covers compliance with APHIS regulations and requirements. The importer or designee is responsible for confirming with CBP and PPQ at the destination port in advance of each shipment, that CBP and PPQ has the capacity to clear or handle permitted air, land, and maritime cargo shipments, including bulk, mail, and express consignment shipments.

The permittee is the legal importer of an article and is responsible for complying with the permit conditions. The permittee must be at least 18 years of age and have and maintain an address in the United States that is specified on the permit and be physically present during normal business hours at that address during any periods when articles are being imported or moved interstate under the permit; or If another legal entity, maintain an address or business office in the United States with a designated individual for service of process; and serve as the contact for the purpose of communications associated with the movement of the regulated article for the duration of the permit.

Any person who violates the Plant Protection Act (PPA) of the United States, individuals or corporations who fail to comply with these conditions and authorizations, or who forge, counterfeit, or deface permits may be criminally or administratively prosecuted and found guilty of a misdemeanor which can result in penalties, a one-year prison term, or both. In addition, all current permits may be cancelled and future permit applications denied.

Shipment Details:

The shipment must be free from soil (unless authorized), prohibited plant materials and plant parts, other regulated foreign matter or debris, and quarantine living organisms such as parasitic plants, pathogens, insects, snails, and mites.

If the shipment requires treatment as a condition of entry, or if official personnel find that the shipment is contaminated with a quarantine plant pest, is commingled with prohibited plant material, or if required documentation is incomplete or missing, they will require the shipment and any other material associated with the shipment (i.e. pallets, packaging, conveyance) to be treated, reexported, or destroyed at the consignee's expense.

If treatment is required, shipments must be presented ready for treatment, as specified in the [ACIR Treatment General Reference](#) document. If cargo requiring fumigation is containerized, the cargo must be on pallets with at least two inches of space under the commodity and between the pallets, and have a minimum space of 18 inches above the commodity to allow for gas circulation. Shipments that are packaged in a way that impedes inspection or treatment (i.e. wrapped, coated, dipped, sprayed, or otherwise packaged in impermeable material) may be delayed inspection or refused entry.

All Wood Packing Materials (WPM) with the shipment are subject to treatment and IPPC Stamp requirements in accordance with 7CFR319.40-3.

Garlic (*Allium sativum*) (All Plant Parts Including Seed) from Argentina into All Ports

1. This commodity is subject to inspection at the port of entry and all general requirements of [7 CFR 319.56-3](#).
2. Whole bulbs or cloves, both peeled or unpeeled, are admissible.
 - 2.1. Peeled cloves (no papery portion remaining) are processed products. Peeled cloves are allowed, subject to inspection, from all countries into all ports. See the related documents section below for import requirements.

- 4. This commodity is subject to inspection at the port of entry and all general requirements of [7 CFR 319.56-3](#).
- 5. White asparagus does not require treatment as a condition of entry.
- 6. If green is visible, REQUIRE T101-b-1.

Avocado (*Persea americana*) (Fruit) from Peru into Continental U.S. Ports

- 7. Only Hass variety avocados are admissible.
- 8. This commodity is subject to inspection at the port of entry and all general requirements of [7 CFR 319.56-3](#).
- 9. Each consignment must be accompanied by a **phytosanitary certificate** issued by the National Plant Protection Organization (NPPO) of the country of origin with an additional declaration stating the produce in the consignment were grown, packed, and inspected and found free of pests in accordance with the requirements authorized under 7 CFR 319.56-4.
- 10. Commercial Consignments Only
- 11. Do not import or distribute into or within Hawaii, Puerto Rico, or any U.S. territory.
